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PRECAUTIONARY DRINKING WATER ADVISORY

Whitecap - Community Water Distribution System EXPANDED ADVISORY TO INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING LOCATIONS ONLY: (CHIEF WHITECAP TRAIL) - Hse #'s 212, 216, 218, 220, 224, 230 & 236; (MOOSE WOODS DRIVE) - Hse #'s 301,306, 307, 312, 313, Clinic, School, Daycare, Elder's Building, Hse #'s 317, 319, 325, 329, 330, 331, 333, 339, 342, 345, 348, 349, 351, 357, 358, 363, 364, 369 & Hse #'s 201-215; (SAGE HILL) - Hse #'s 400-414; (SANDY RIDGE) - Hse #'s 500-514; & (HILLCREST PLACE, COURT & WAY) - Hse #'s 600-628 because of a loss of pressure in the distribution systems related to planned distribution system upgrades.

This Advisory applies to all homes and public buildings connected to the water system identified above and is effective as of:

Monday, May 15, 2017

Due to the conditions or deficiencies note above, the safety of this drinking water supply cannot be assured. Affected consumers should take the following precautions:

- (a) Boil all water to be used for drinking for at least one (1) minute, and store it in a sanitized container;
- (b) Boil water to be used for other activities where it may be enter a person's mouth, including:
 - (i) brushing teeth or soaking false teeth;
 - (ii) washing fruits and vegetables;
 - (iii) adding to food or drink which will not be subsequently heated; and
 - (iv) making ice cubes;
- (c) Do not drink from any public drinking fountains supplied with water from the public water supply
- (d) Water used for other household purposes does not usually need to be boiled. Adults, adolescents and older children may shower, bathe or wash using tap water but should not swallow the water. Dishes and laundry may be washed in tap water, either by hand or by machine (dishes should be rinsed in water with a tablespoon of bleach in a sink full of water);
- (e) When bathing infants and young children, ensure they do not ingest the water;
- (f) If you do not wish to boil your water, you should use an alternative water source known to be safe, such as bottled water; and
- (g) Consult with your physician if you have cuts or rashes that are severe before using the water.

***Affected homes should be notified and this notice should be posted in conspicuous places in public buildings.**

Next Steps The Advisory will be removed once the required Standard Protocol Procedures have been completed. Affected water users will be notified once this has occurred
